## LITURGY CORNER

As you have already received several bulletin inserts concerning the Roman Missal and the changes coming about beginning Advent 2011, this corner will answer some FAQ (Frequently Asked ?'s). Advent, 2011, is a little way off, but we want everyone to be apprised of the changes as we receive them.

### ROMAN MISSAL - Frequently Asked Questions

#### 1. Why was there a need for a new translation?

The *Missale Romanum (Roman Missal)*, the ritual text for the celebration of the Mass, was promulgated by Pope Paul VI in 1970 as the definitive text of the reformed liturgy of the Second Vatican Council. That Latin text, the *editio typice* (typical edition), was translated into various languages for use around the world; the English edition was published in the United States in 1973. The Holy See issued a *revised text* in 1975. Pope John Paul II promulgated the third edition of the *Missale Romanum* during the Jubilee Year in 2000. Among other things, the third edition contains prayers for the celebration of recently canonized saints, additional prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, additional Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Intentions, and some updated and revised rubrics (instructions) for the celebration of the Mass. To aid the process of translation of the *Missale Romanum*, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments issued *Liturgiam Authenticam*, in 2001 - an instruction on the vernacular translation of the Roman Liturgy which outlines the principles and rules for translation. In 2007, the Congregation for Divine Worship used the *Ratio Translationis for the English Language*, which outlined the specific rules for translation in English.

**NATURAL LAW SYMPOSIUM**

The St. Thomas Lawyers Guild, a thirty five year old organization of Catholic and other Christian lawyers, is sponsoring its first Natural Law Symposium on October 9, 2010 at 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM at St. John Fisher College, Basil Auditorium, Room 135.

The Guild's Vice President, Michael DiPrima Esq. pointed out that our Founding Fathers premised the existence of our government and its laws upon the Natural Law. He stated that the interest in the Natural Law is at its highest since the 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> Centuries when it stood firm in response to the contrasting principals of totalitarianism, and changed the outcome for the world. Noted scholars will explain what the Natural Law is, how by right reason one finds and applies its principles, its relationship to our rights and duties, and, especially, its limitations on the powers of government.

The speakers, beginning with local attorney, Ronald J Buttarazzi Esq. will note the importance of the subject, followed by college Professor, Dr. Kenneth Deutsch, who will trace its beginnings from Socrates, followed by college Professor, Dr. Joseph Fornieri, dealing with Lincoln and the Natural as instituted and intended by Thomas Jefferson and the founders, and then by college Professor, Dr. Peter Colosi, who will follow it through the Nuremberg Trials to James Valenti , Esq.J.D.,LL.M, who will relate it to some current U.S. Supreme Court decisions. If time allows, the panel will answer questions.

Di Prima explained that this first symposium on the Natural Law will endeavor to explain the basics of Natural Law, as well as how judicial decisions affect the conduct of government and its peoples. Cosponsoring the symposium with the Guild is The Campus Ministry at St. John Fisher College
