Fr. Lance Gonyo will celebrate a Mass for "Day of the Dead" on Sunday, October 30 at 1:00 PM at Nativity in Brockport. All are welcome. A tradition in Mexico, they believe the spirits of the dead return for a banquet on November 1 and so prepare an altar and banquet. Items on the altar include the deceased favorite foods, yellow flowers, photos of the deceased and sugar skulls and skeletons. The skulls are used to honor the dead and symbolize death and rebirth and a continuation of life.

U. S. CATHOLICS CONFRONT GLOBAL POVERTY

OUR VOICE IS NEEDED NOW!

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and Catholic Relief Services are asking for our help to support U. S. poverty-focused international assistance so that life-changing and life-saving assistance can continue to reach those who most need our help around the world. Last year the U. S. House of Representatives reduced poverty-focused international assistance by 8% and are considering cutting another 13% this year - even though poverty-focused U. S. international assistance amounts to less than 1% of the U. S. budget and provides critical help for people around the world suffering from poverty, disease and violence. Among the poverty-focused development and humanitarian assistance supported by USCCB and CRS: child survival and maternal health, orphans and displaced children, infectious diseases, vaccines, food for education, debt relief, agricultural development, disaster assistance and more. As advocates for human life and dignity, we can urge our members of the U. S. House of Representatives to protect funding for critical poverty-focused international assistance for the poorest people in the 2012 federal budget. This international aid saves lives, fosters hope, and builds friendships for the United States. Call U. S. Representative Kathy Hochul at 585-270 4828 today.

MESSAGE: I urge you to reject disproportionate cuts in poverty-focused development and humanitarian assistance. Our federal budget is a moral statement and should not ignore the basic human needs of the poorest and most vulnerable people in the world. I recognize the serious challenge Congress faces, but, cutting programs for the poorest people does not reflect our best values as a nation and will have minimal effect on our country's economic problems because we already spend so little in international assistance.

Please call Representative Hochul today and voice your concern.
