Due to the recent events in the Middle East, tourism has not been as promising as it once was. The lack of tourists has caused families to face devastating economic strain, since this is their only source of income. Through the sale of religious articles, we bring hope to the lives of many Christians whose income depends on this work. Thank you for your support. There are many items that would make wonderful Easter, Confirmation or First Eucharist gifts, (Easter is April 8, Confirmation is April 30 and First Eucharist is May 5). Feliz Ano Nuevo from Migrant Ministry!

We celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe at Nativity on Sun., Dec. 11, with a procession singing "Las Mananitas" (good morning greetings - even though it was 1:00 PM!!) to Mary, and presented her with dozens of roses. During the Mass, we witnessed a beautiful representation of her appearance, enacted by five members of our community. Then we went next door and had a feast including tamales and other typical foods. The Hispanic/Latino Bishops of the United States greeted the undocumented immigrant community on December 12, with a letter to immigrants. Signed by 13 bishops, the letter was released simultaneously from Los Angeles and San Antonio, the sees of the two highest ranking Hispanic archbishops.

Northwest Parishes and Faith Communities

Update for the Parishes and Faith Communities of the Northwest Planning Group

As many of you may already know, Fr. Matthew Kawiak, the assisting priest at the Brockport Newman Community, recently and unexpectedly left his position to move to a church in our neighboring diocese. Margot Van Etten, Director of Catholic Campus Ministry at Brockport Newman, has since then worked with diocesan priest personnel and local priests to ensure that priests were available to preside at Masses in late December and January. The diocese has committed to help the community arrange for sacramental ministry and Mass coverage through the spring semester so that long-term planning can be done. There is no intention to discontinue campus ministry at Brockport Newman.

The Northwest Pastoral Plan was developed by our communities and approved by Bishop Clark 7 years ago in recognition that the declining numbers of priests serving within our diocese would necessitate our number of assigned priests to drop from five to four sometime between 2008 and 2013. Therefore, Fr. Kawiak will not be replaced.

The pastoral leaders of our six communities met on Wednesday, January 4th with Karen Rinefierd, our liaison from the diocesan Office of Pastoral Planning, and Shannon Loughlin, diocesan Director of Young Adult and Campus Ministries, to have an initial conversation about the long term. Over the course of the next several months the pastoral leaders, the Northwest Planning Council, and all of our communities will be involved in developing specifics of how we can meet the sacramental needs of Brockport Newman, the migrant ministry, and our four parishes with one fewer priest. There will be regular communication with parishioners.

In the meantime, we thank those priests who so graciously have offered their services to Brockport Newman.
