**DRIVEN BY A DREAM: RWANDA**

Gloriose Uwamahoro and her husband, Karekezi Jean Pierre, live in Kigali, Rwanda. They are no strangers to hardship and hard work, selling vegetables and water at a kiosk and a market from morning to late at night. Malnutrition is widespread in Rwanda. Their daughter, like many other children in Rwanda, was malnourished. Gloriose joined a US-funded project led by Catholic Relief Services to help the Rwandan government combat malnutrition. She learned about balanced meals, importance of good hygiene, and how to grow a kitchen garden for family food. Through a Catholic Relief Services micro-savings group, she learned how loans could help her grow their vegetable-selling business. Now the parents earn enough to feed their family and can afford to fulfill their dream of sending the children to school. *Our sacrifices during this holy season of Lent have the power to change lives - deepening our faith and our connection to our one human family.*

## VICAR GENERAL AND CHANCELLOR

Question: I have seen the title of Vicar General and Chancellor used in our Catholic newspaper. Who are they and what do they do?

Answer: A bishop is in charge of a diocese and appoints people to help with the administration. Two of those positions are the Vicar General and the Chancellor. Both play a role in the life of a diocese, despite the many jokes priests may tell at their expense! A chancellor is the archivist of a diocese, charged with task of keeping the records of the diocese. Often a bishop may add other responsibilities and the chancellor may end up being like the executive director of the diocesan office. The chancellor does not need to be a priest.

The vicar general is a priest, appointed by the bishop and acts in the name of the bishop in the administration of the diocese. He has an advanced degree in canon law or theology. He also has executive authority within the diocese. This means that he is involved in the day-to-day pastoral and temporal administration of the diocese. Canon law does not allow a bishop to appoint a relative to the position, nor the priest in charge of the sacrament of penance. In both cases, the purpose of the law is to avoid conflicts of interest.

## INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Have you ever given thought to the fact that you are an "ambassador for Christ?" An ambassador is an accredited diplomat and official representative. We are asked to be ambassadors for Christ and his message of reconciliation. Within each one of us is a prodigal son who realizes the need to return home, and elder brother who struggles with entitlement and self-pity, and a forgiving father who simply wants to celebrate love. Realizing that all of these things are operative in our hearts, we can bring credibility to God's ministry of reconciliation. Genuine witnesses are those who not only recognize their need for wholeness, mercy, and forgiveness but also their tendency to be over self-focused and stubborn. Then, discovering freedom from all that binds them, they can then extend the love they have received to others. These ambassadors embody unity, mercy and reconciliation and can look on others with deep compassion because they know what it is to walk in their shoes. ## HOLY THURSDAY

The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday ends the season of Lent and begins the Triduum, the sacred three days when we commemorate the Passion and resurrection of Christ. The church looks different: The tabernacle is completely empty; its doors may be opened and the sanctuary lamp is extinguished. At Mass, bells ring during the Glory to God, but then they remain silent until the Easter Vigil. The washing of the feet may follow the homily. Contributions to the poor are included in the procession of the gifts, including the Rice Bowls which are returned on Holy Thursday. The Eucharistic prayer recalls that this is the night on which Jesus was handed over and on which he handed over his Body and Blood to us. After Communion the leftover consecrated bread is placed in a vessel on the altar and incensed. The priest picks up the vessel with the humeral veil and processes through the church to a separate chapel suitably decorated. The Blessed Sacrament is incensed again and closed inside a tabernacle.

No other Mass is celebrated this day - not even in the morning - without permission of the bishop and only for serious reasons. Holy communion may be given to the sick, but no one else may share in communion outside of Mass.

After Mass the altar is stripped, and the crosses in the church are removed or veiled. The faithful may begin the paschal fast, which is obligatory on Good Friday but urged on Holy Saturday as well. They are encouraged to pray before the Blessed Sacrament sometime before midnight remembering how Jesus asked Peter, "Could you not stay awake with me one hour?" (Mt 26:40)
